TRAILBLAZERS ACADEMY

- 100% of eighth-grade students will successfully transition into high school.
- At least 80 of 150 (53%) students will develop and maintain at least 1 lasting community relationship.
- At least 80 of 150 (53%) students will have a family member that is very involved in their school life.
- Decrease the number of students who are not proficient in reading by 25% by March 2007 administration of CMT.
- Decrease the number of students who are not proficient in math by 25% by March 2007 administration of CMT.
- Decrease the number of students who visited problem solving from 10 per day to 2 per day.

STAMFORD ACADEMY

- Attendance rate will be at least 90% .
- School will meet AYP goals for CAPT.
- Improve literacy and math skills.
- 100% of all seniors will graduate.
- At least 75% of all graduating seniors will continue their education.
- 100% of graduating seniors will successfully move on.
- At least 80 out of 125 (64%) students will develop and maintain at least one lasting community connection.
- At least 80 out of 125 (64%) students will have a parent that is very involved in their school life.

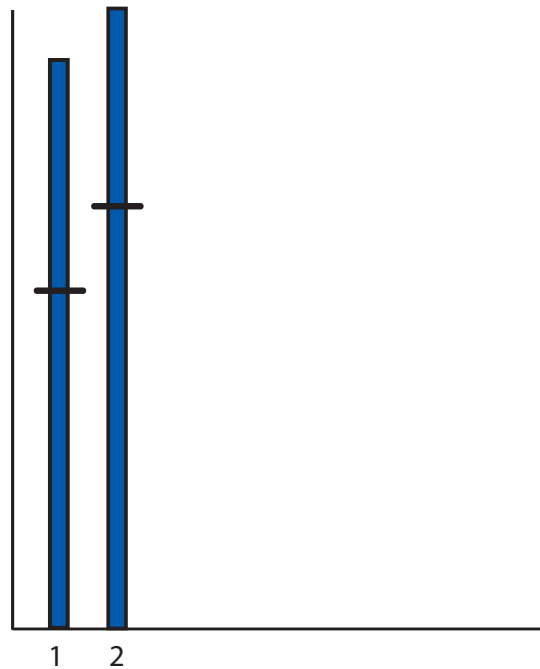

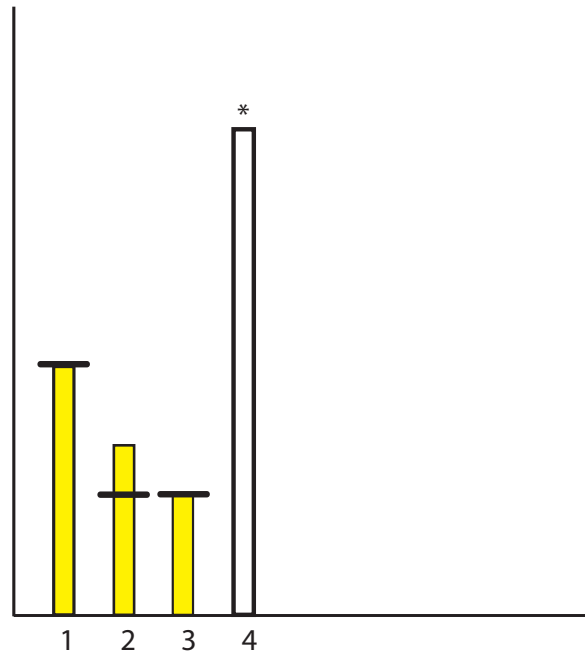

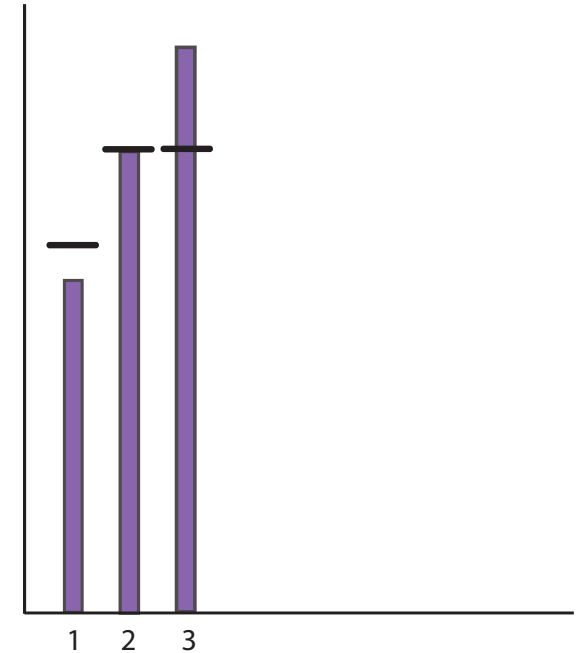

JUVENILE REVIEW BOARD (JRB)

1. As of June 2007, 34 of the 54 youth (63%) who are referred to the JRB between July 1, 2006, and December 31, 2006, will remain arrest free for at least 6 months.
2. As of June 2007, 26 of the 36 youth (72%) who are referred to the JRB between January 1, 2007, and April 1, 2007, will remain arrest free for at least 3 months.

PROJECT HOPE

1. At least 25 youth who are identified as low- to medium risk of committing a crime will initiate, develop, and maintain a solid community connection.
2. Barry will build 10 trusting relationships with youth who are identified as at high risk for committing a violent crime.
3. 10 community agencies will become aware of the program.
4. Youth violence in Stamford will from December 2006 through June 2007 will be significantly lower than the same period one year prior.

ARTS (Alternative Routes to Success)

1. At least 17 of 33 students served (57%) will attend at least 80% of their classes.
2. At least 23 of 33 students served (70%) will have lasting community connections.
3. At least 23 of the 33 students served (70%) will have a family member who is involved in school life.

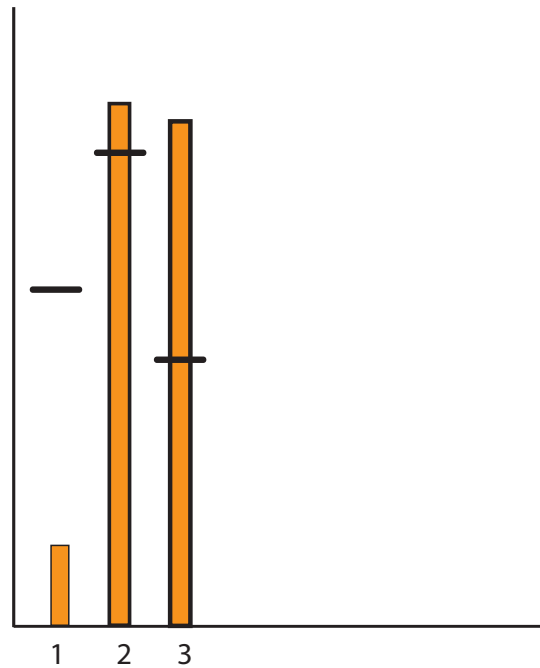

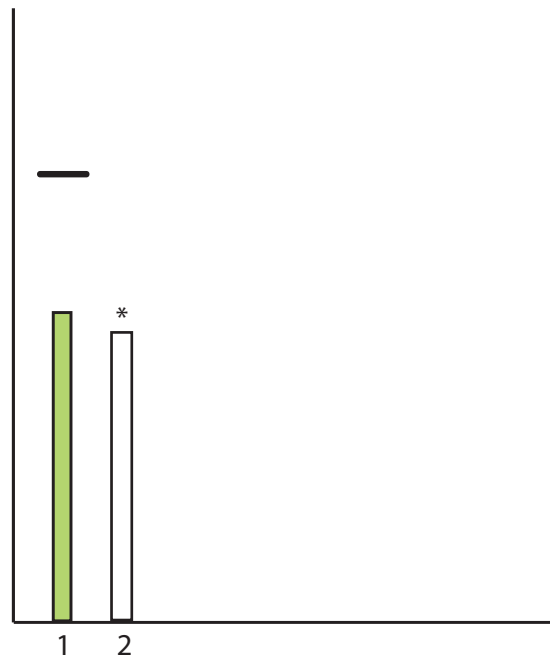

Lion's Den OST Program



CHESTER ADDISON COMMUNITY CENTER

1. At least 50 of 100 (50%) youth actively enrolled will improve their reading performance by at least 1.5 grade levels.
2. At least 49 of 70 (70%) youth served by the educational advocates will improve their academic performance.
3. At least 4 of 10 (40%) youth identified with severe behavioral problems will significantly improve their behavior in school.

LION'S DEN OST PROGRAM

1. At least 60 of 80 (75%) youth who regularly participate in the program will improve their reading levels by 50% more than the average improvement made by Trailblazers Academy students.
2. At least 15 of 30 Trailblazers Academy staff members will report that the Lion's Den program was helpful to them and to the kids.
