Since 1972, Domus has served children and young people facing many obstacles, including a chronic lack of basic needs, physical and mental abuse, and generational poverty, among others. Our goal for the young people we serve, through our programs and services, is to create the conditions – trust, compassion, guidance, and love – necessary for them to get on a path toward health and opportunity so they can engage and succeed in school and ultimately have satisfying and productive lives. Domus is the only organization in Stamford addressing the needs of young people in this comprehensive manner with the myriad of challenges these young people possess.

<u>DOMUS KIDS</u> is a Stamford-based nonprofit that supports almost 1,400 vulnerable, high-risk young people to rise above adversity through compassion, understanding, and guidance.
